LEAF-CTC:

<u>Brokens:</u> Well made good liquoring types met with a good demand and sold at around last levels. Select few lines of popular best types were slightly dearer. All others met with selective demand at easier rates and suffered large withdrawals.

Fannings: A small weight of the best types offered sold readily at firm to little dearer rates. Medium and the plainer types met with selective demand and there were considerable withdrawals.

<u>Dust:</u> Well made good liquoring sorts met with a fairly strong demand and sold at dearer rates of Tk. 3/5 and often more following quality. Others were about steady. Plainer types were easier and suffered fair withdrawals. CD's were a strong market.

<u>Comment:</u> Offering was large and comprised mostly plain, poor and re-printed teas. Interest was generally confined to the clean good liquoring types on offer which sold well at firm to dearer rates. There was also some interest at the lower end of the market. Withdrawals continue to be heavy especially in the Medium and the plainer category.
