Fannings: Likewise, select few best types sold well at generally easier rates of Tk 3/5. Others met with only a limited demand at easier rates with majority remaining unsold.

Dust: Met with a good demand. Clean useful liquoring types sold well at firm to little dearer rates whilst others met with a fair demand and sold at little easier rates. CD's were a little better market with prices following quality.

Comment: There was initially a fair demand which slackened progressively leading to easier rates and heavy withdrawals. Blenders were the major contenders but apparently lacked strength. Loose Tea Traders operated at the lower end of the market. The receding weight of the cleaner types offered however, sold well.
